The Leopard • a.k.a. **Il Gattopardo** • starring: Burt Lancaster, Alain Delon, Claudia Cardinale • Italy/France **1963** • director: Luchino Visconti • music: Nino Rota • based on the novel by Giuseppe Tomasi di Lampedusa • costume design: Piero Tosi (Oscar nominated) • **Summary:** The Prince of Salina (Lancaster), a Sicilian aristocrat, tries to preserve his family and class amid the tumultuous social upheavals of 1860s Sicily. *The Leopard* is a grand cinematic example of historic drama. An outstanding and visually lavish production, it is regarded as one of Luchino Visconti's crowning achievements.
